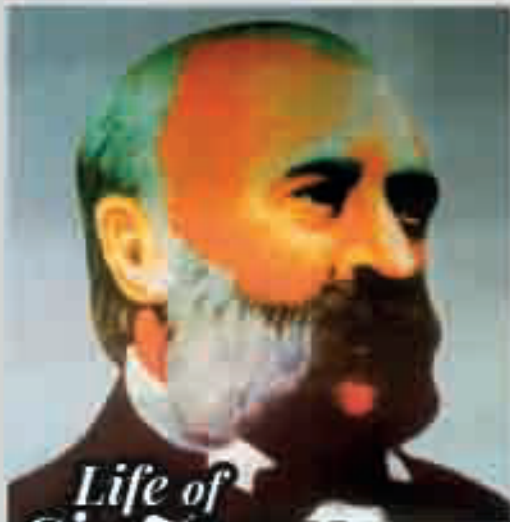

Life of
**Sir James
Marshall,**
MA, BL, CMG, KCSG.

He was born on 18th of December 1829. His father was a Presbyterian Minister and his mother Mary Richmond was a housewife.

EDUCATION

At age 16, he lost his right arm as a result of an accidental gunshot. Not disturbed by this occurrence, he still continued his education at Oxford University and graduated at age 18 in 1847. He went to read law and was called to the bar at Middle Temple in 1868 (Lincoln's Inn)

APPOINTMENT

In the year 1852 he was appointed as an Anglican Minister Curate at Trysull. In 1859, he left for St. Bartholomew (London) where he continued his Curacy.

CONVERSION

On the 21st November 1857, he converted to a layman in the Catholic Church by Rev. Fr. Robert Aston Cotton, later Bishop Cotton. He continued work as Chief Magistrate and Judicial Assessor of the Gold Coast. In 1879, he was appointed as Chief Justice for British West Africa (Ghana and Nigeria).

In 1887, he was offered Justice of Nigeria which he declined due to ill health but helped to establish the Judicial System in Nigeria.

MISSIONARY ZEAL

He worked hard for the re-establishment of the Catholic Church in Ghana, and was instrumental in Rev. Frs. Auguste Moreau and Eugene Murat's (SMA) coming to the Gold Coast on the 18th of May, 1880. On the 29th June, 1882 he was Knighted, KCMG by the Queen Victoria of Great Britain. He was made the Knight

Commander of the Order of St. Gregory (KCSG) by Pope Leo XIII in Rome on the 20th January, 1889.

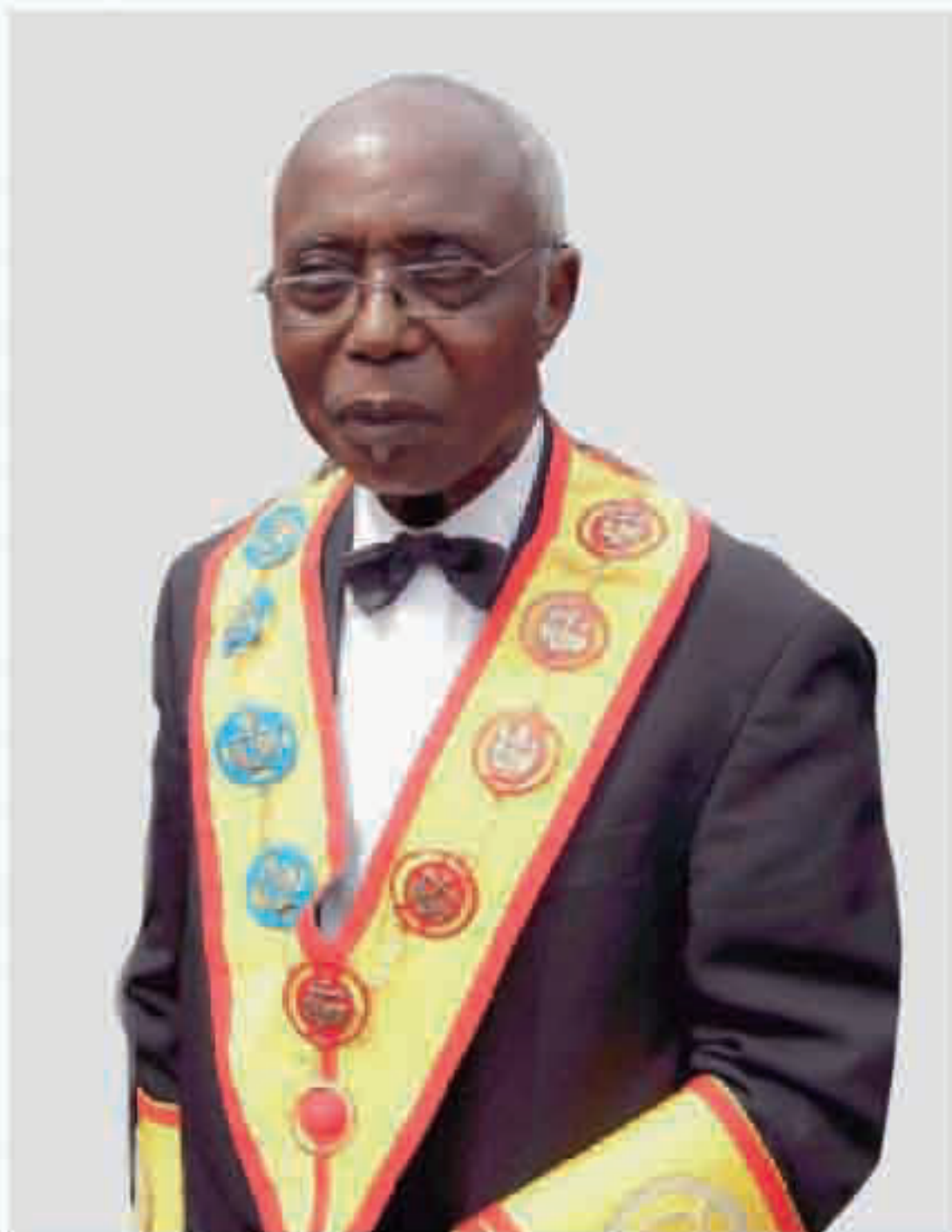
DEATH

He died on the 9th of August, 1889, at Margate and was buried at Mortlake (London).

Profile of MRL Sis. Elizabeth Anderson-Yebuah (25th Grand Lady)

I was initiated into the Noble Order of the Ladies of Marshall in the year 1978, shortly after the completion of my National Service with the then Salaga Secondary School, at Salaga, in the Northern Region. It was also my first time in that part of the Country and was therefore very exciting for me to go there.

In December of 1978, I joined Court 5 as a visiting Sister from Court 12 Tamale and witnessed the installation of MRL Francisca Otoo as Noble Lady of Court 5 and the Consecration of Court 26, Tema. I finally transferred to Court 5 in 1984 with the assistance of MRL Justina Laing who took a liking to me and greatly encouraged me to do so. Her admonition had always been that she saw in me the potential to progress beyond a mere visiting Sister, and the earlier I gained my transfer, the better it would be for me.

Even before my transfer to Court 5, I assisted the Court as Organist, a position I held for several years thereafter.

In addition to my position as a member of Court 5 and Organist for the Court, I served on several committees of the Court and

doubled as an Auxiliary Sentry whenever the need arose.

In December of 1999, I was elected Deputy Noble Lady of the Court and was installed Noble Lady in December of 2000 for the 2001 Administration.

I served as the Immediate Past Noble Lady, Noble Advisor and Past Noble Advisor for the Court. I was also Reader and Lecturer for both the Lower Degree and Mystic Psychology Course.

I was appointed Regional Advocate in 2003, Assistant Grand Advocate in September of 2004 and was installed and served as Grand Advocate for the Grand Court from 2005 to 2019.

While serving as the Grand Advocate of the Grand Court, I was invited by the Supreme Council in 2006 to serve as one of the first Trustees of the Marshalian Investment Fund and remained on the committee for several years as its Vice Chairperson.

I also served as member of the following Committees:

i) Knighthood Forum, comprising the Knights and Ladies of Marshall, and the Knights and Ladies Auxiliary of St. John International. Whilst on the committee I served as



Treasurer and Financial Secretary respectively and assisted with the initial drafting of the governing Regulations for the Forum.

ii) Marshallan Relief and Development Services (MAREDES) since its inception as a member, Vice Chair and its chairperson.

iii) Marshallan Medical Fund as one of the Trustees and worked diligently to grow the Fund.

iv) Member of the Steering Committee of the 7th and 9th Marshallan Reunion Conferences held at Legon, University of Ghana.

v) Member of the Strategic Planning Committee of the Noble Order of the Knights and Ladies of Marshall.

vi) Member of the Grand Court Project Committee,

vii) Member of the Ritual and Constitutional Committee of the Grand Court

viii) Joint Consultative Forum of the Grand Court and Supreme Council for four (4) years as it prepared towards the inauguration of the first State Court and Council in Togo.

ix) Member of the MaSIF Management Committee.

While serving as the President of the Cathedral Marshallan Association I worked hard with my Brothers and Sisters of the Association to ensure the Consecration of Court 67, Accra Central in the year 2000.

As Noble Lady of Court 5 I set up the "LOM Trust" (Ladies of Marshallan Trust Fund) to raise funds which were invested to cater for needy sisters in the Court.

I have travelled extensively to many Regions in Ghana, Togo, London, Sierra Leone and Liberia to perform duties assigned to me by the Grand Court.

I was a member of the team that saw to the

Consecration of Court 82, SouthEast London, Court 87, Hackney, Central London, Court 103 Pokuase and Court 107, Sierra Leone.

In all, I acted as the Installation Sentry.

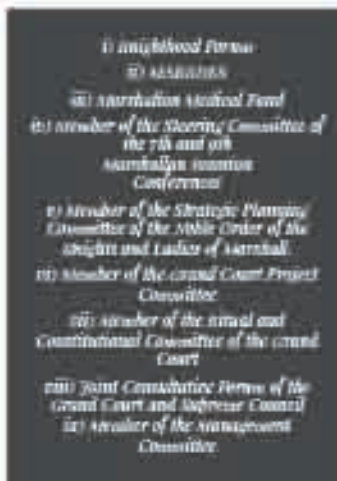
With the acquisition of the land by the Grand Court at Parkoso, I was appointed a member of a committee set up by the Grand Court to

conceptualize the Grand Court Project and supported the

Chairperson, MRL Felicity Acquah, to launch the sod cutting ceremony for the commencement of the Grand Court Project.

In recognition of my works to the Noble Order of the Ladies of Marshall, the Grand Court graciously presented me for the position of Deputy Grand Lady in 2019 and was duly installed in August 2019 as the Deputy Grand Lady.

Since then, I have continued in my various assignments and



commitments to the Noble Order of the Ladies of Marshall after my installation to the honorable position of Deputy Grand Lady, in the Consecration of New Courts, Installations of officers and performing other functions or duties assigned to me by the Grand Court.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my late father, Brother T. S. Anderson (PGK) of Council 10 who greatly influenced our collective decision as a family to join the Noble Order of the Knights and Ladies of Marshall. I especially want to thank MRL Alberta Sekyi Hughes and indeed all Past Grand Ladies whom I have at all times regarded as my mentors and role models for the period I worked with them.

Though sometimes their admonitions had seemed unpleasant, later realization upon reflection had shown them to be corrective and had helped to bring me this far. Indeed, it has been variously stated that those that love you will always be on your back to ensure that you are kept on the right path. Their influence had been invaluable and very much appreciated.

It is my fervent hope that the Lord we serve and who has brought us this far will continue to walk with us and give us the needed grace and direction to climb heights that only He can provide their attainment.

Fathers, Supreme Knight, Substantive Past Grand Ladies and Supreme Knights, Sir Knights, Most Respected Ladies, Deputy Supreme Knight, Respected Ladies, my dear officers of our Noble and honorable fraternity, good evening. This is the day the Lord has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it.

Before I begin my speech, I would like to crave your indulgence to observe a minutes silence in honour of MRL Sister Victoria Yellu whom we lost painfully this year and MRL Sis. Frances Mensah Kane who has also joined the Noble Order above. I kindly request our Chaplain, Sir Kt Bro. Rev. Fr. James Buor-Mensah to say a prayer for the peaceful repose of their souls.

To God will always be the glory for the many good things He bestows on his children and for his continual grace and mercy on us. It has pleased Him to make this day

possible and willed me to ascend the honorable throne of the Grand Court as its 25th Grand Lady in the in the Fiftieth (50th) year of its inauguration. I thank you Lord for how far you have brought me. It is my prayer that the Spirit that descended on the Apostles on the day of Pentecost will fill me and every sister of our Noble Fraternity with that consuming fire of love as we move forward in the year of our own Pentecost, so that, fired by that Divine Love and thus emboldened, we will be fully committed in our service to the Church, the Tenets and Principles of the Noble Order of the Knights and Ladies of Marshall, our Country, Communities and humanity.

My dear sisters, fifty years down the line, you will agree with me that my predecessors and the officers that supported them, have done a yeomans job by the many sacrifices made to bring the Order this far. I solemnly pledge to continue with their good works during my reign as Grand Lady and promise to do the little that I can, to advance the cause of our existence. Fortunately for me, many of them will be around for a very long time to assist me in charting a brighter future for the Noble Order.



To all my sisters of the Accra and Tema Courts, I dedicate this honor done me to you and equally extend my gratitude to all my brothers, both Senior and Junior members in our Region, who have over the years encouraged and offered me opportunities to serve at various levels to achieve this feat. In a very special way. I wish to acknowledge Sir Kt. Vet. Bro. Cdr. Dr. Edmund S. K. Kwaw, the Supreme Director, Sir Kt. Bro. Samuel Barnes and MRL Sis. Joana Barnes, Sir Kt. Bro. Eddie Prah, Sir Kt. Bro. Dr. Dr. Professor George Wireko Brobbey and a host of others who for many years have counseled and encouraged me as I encountered them.

At this juncture, permit me to share my vision for the Ladies of Marshall as I take up the mantle for the next two years with my team of officers, as your Grand Lady.

My sisters, our Society, the Ladies of Marshall celebrated 50 years of its existence in 2019 which was climaxed in 2020, COVID-19 notwithstanding. This year on exactly 25th September 2021, the Grand Court itself will be 50 years since its inauguration as the Societys administrative body.

Looking back, we can proudly say that we have achieved a lot. From a humble beginning of nine (9) Courts with a membership of 386 sisters, we are now on our 160th Court with a membership of over 4,000 sisters spread across two continents and eight countries and still counting. From rented premises where we held our meetings, many have now acquired their own

meeting places with their brother counterparts, and others are striving to do so.

The Grand Court has also not been left out. Through the instrumentality and hard work of my predecessors, we can now boast of a landed property housing a secretariat, with a meeting hall under construction, a projected hostel in the not-too-distant future, and a host of other laudable suggestions from sisters to consider in enhancing the project. Also, these have been possible by the generous contributions and support of sisters from the various courts, not forgetting the active support from our brothers and the Supreme Council.

Alongside our successes, dear Sisters, we have some challenges that threatens to engulf us. These are: Lack of Unity among sisters, delinquency among members, indiscipline, and sometimes the general apathy to programs of the Noble Order are but a few examples that I want to touch. I believe we have not been successful in dealing with these challenges because we have refused to allow the structures within the Noble Order to work. Our failures must be of grave concern to all of us as we move forward as a select group, called to serve God and humanity. We must not pay lip service to what we profess but try to internalize them. For me, our focus should be that we reflect deeply on the fifty or more years of our existence as a group in terms of the tenets and principles of the Noble



Order, and deal with the unacceptable tendencies amongst us as we move forward to a more positive and desirable future.

My dear sisters, during my reign as your Grand Lady, I will therefore want to focus on two major areas that I believe, can help transform our society into one we would all want.

My first focus will be to pursue an agenda aimed at enhancing the knowledge of our sisters in the social teachings of the Church. It is said that knowledge is power, and it is my firm belief that as sisters become more knowledgeable in the teachings of the Church and have a better understanding and appreciation of the rituals we perform whenever we meet, they will impact positively on them and help remove the negative tendencies that threaten to engulf us in carrying out our duties. I will appeal to our Spiritual Director and the Supreme Chaplaincy to come out with programs that can guide the chaplains in our Courts to carry out regular teachings at Court sessions and spiritual activities during our various Court meetings and all other spiritual gatherings.

Just as in Leviticus 10:11 the lord God charged the priests,

“... to teach the people of Israel all the laws which I have given to you through Moses,”

we will need our chaplains to teach us the laws of the church and the Noble Order so that guided, we would shape our characters to be good and faithful servants for the

church and humanity. Luckily for us, the Supreme Council has started the webinar series that offers another opportunity for us to be educated in the teachings of the Church. I will rely on my Regional Noble Ladies to fashion out programs that will make the webinar lectures accessible to all sisters.

My second focus would be to invite sisters to deeply reflect on the tenets and principles of the Noble Order as envisaged by the 13 gallant young men and consider how well we have heeded to the calls to Unity, Charity, Fraternity and Service, in the fifty years of our existence as Ladies of Marshall. This request may seem repetitive since all my predecessors have dwelt on them in one way or the other. If I am also harping on it, it is an indication that, as a society, we are not getting the desired results and therefore we must constantly remind ourselves to enable us achieve this goal.

I believe that by strictly adhering to the Tenets and Principles of the Noble Order, we can fully attain the spiritual upliftment that seems to be eluding many of us, and throwing our Courts into dissensions, disharmony, and gross indiscipline. In tackling these situations, my fervent hope is that all of us will make a conscious effort to work together to make this possible so that at the end of it we can make this society the preferred society for any person to join in any of our parishes.



On my part, as I assume the leadership of the Ladies of Marshall, and as I pledge my commitment to these ideals, I would demand an equal commitment from all sisters, and adherence to these ideals and principles. I believe that as we abide by the rules and regulations handed down by my predecessors, we can continually enjoy the Unity, Peace, and Harmony within the society.

As your Grand Lady, I will ensure the general well-being of all sisters and actively promote the much-needed sorority amongst us, as we move forward as a society; that this vision for our fraternity can only become possible if all of us commit to it.

First and foremost, it is imperative that we allow all the structures that have been put in place by our leaders for the smooth administration within the Noble Order, to work. By so doing, we would achieve something positive for the order by removing the negative images that have been attributed to our Noble Order and make it attractive once again for others.

We must endeavor by our conducts, be it collectively or individually, to act in all circumstances in a manner that will bring honor to us, by saying what we do and doing what we say. Our performances should define for every action the expected result, whether in quality, quantity, commitment and expected conformity.

GROWING DELINQUENCY AMONG SISTERS

It is becoming increasingly clear that many sisters become delinquent because of their inability to pay dues or due to sometimes unsavory comments or attitudes of some sisters. With respect to non-payment of dues, I will entreat the Courts to look at the dues imposed on sisters and try to mitigate them. Knowing that a sister must discharge her obligation to the Grand Court, Regional Court, and her own Court, I implore all to give due consideration to all these obligations and fix reasonable dues that could easily be managed by as many sisters as possible. I believe that Courts would be better off having many sisters paying their dues than having a long list of sisters owing dues and not being able to attend Court meetings for fear of embarrassment.

I would also like to entreat sisters that are generously endowed financially to silently or quietly adopt those that are less fortunate by helping them to discharge their obligations to the court. Let us remember and always keep in mind that there are fundamental blessings that always accompany the act of giving rather than receiving. Sisters, very often we are unable to act on these principles that go with the concept of giving because we lack faith. If indeed we are children of God, our actions must portray it. Let us sincerely trust what the Holy Bible tells us and be



happy to help, believing that in giving to others we also open channels of blessings to ourselves.

That notwithstanding, sisters should also do well to participate in the various Marshallan financial schemes that has been put in place to support them for their future wellbeing. We must note that these are schemes that have come to open new opportunities for us to improve our finances for the sustenance of our own well-being and the charity programs of our respective Courts. I will expect my Noble Ladies at all levels to encourage their sisters to actively participate in the Marshallan Security Trust (MST), the Marshallan Savings and Investment Fund (MaSIF) and the Marshallan Medical Fund when they are able and strong so that their future is catered for.

It is my prayer that as we become fully committed to these schemes, we will eagerly attend meetings, and cut down on the current spate of delinquencies in our various Courts.

INDISCIPLINE AMONG SISTERS

My dear sisters, our society is a Noble Order. The picture this must immediately conjure in our minds is a group of disciplined and well-groomed ladies and knights. At the beginning of my speech, I did say that indiscipline is one of our challenges that is becoming increasingly worrisome. This is unacceptable. As people being groomed to take up leadership

positions in our Churches, Society and formators for our youth, such acts of indiscipline should not be our lot.

For instance, it is unacceptable that sisters should gather under trees to converse or loiter while mass is going on. Instead of being active participants in the celebration to receive the blessings that flow from there, the impression we leave is that we do not value the mass, or the graces that flow from it. Some of our priests have often complained about us sitting and waiting for buses to travel while mass is ongoing and had wished that we would have joined them instead of just waiting for a late bus. Let us value the things we have. The mass is the epitome of the Salvific mission of the church, which we must always revere. I will implore all Courts to avoid such conducts that impact negatively on our Noble Order. Sisters, we need the protection of the mass, and we must take every opportunity that is presented to participate in it.

Our mode of dressing is another sour point, causing the Grand Court to send out many extracts on that to warn sisters, but these are still being disobeyed. We must equally endeavor to correct our drinking and eating habits in public. The engagement of unhealthy and amorous relationships with our brothers despite our code of ethics and the constitution must also be of grave concern to all of us as they bring our image into disrepute. If we must be the preferred society in our parishes to ensure the growth of our



membership, these are the areas that require our serious attention.

To check these excesses, I will strictly enforce the rules and regulations set down to correct these unwanted tendencies, to ensure the smooth and healthy administration in the Noble Order. In this, I will rely on my Noble Ladies to enforce the laws and take disciplinary measures against sisters who deliberately flout the rules pertaining to dressing and general comportment at meetings and public places.

In carrying out their mandates however, they must note that they must exercise some restraints in correcting sisters who err. There must be mutual respect for all sisters, irrespective of their station in life. We must learn and take lessons from our Lord Jesus Christ and the humility of Mary, our Mother, Mediator and Patron Saint. Rich as our lord was, he became poor for our sake to make us rich. As leaders we should not lord it over our sisters and excessively deal with those that fall by the wayside. Sometimes a gentle word or prompting would turn the errant sister around. Let us correct each other lovingly to achieve the discipline we yearn for. In the same vein, junior sisters must learn to be obedient to the rules of the order and be respectful to authority.

ORGANIZATION OF THE JUNIOR ORDER

My dear sisters, my vision for the Junior order is to see a self-motivating Junior Knights and Ladies groomed and equipped to take up leadership positions after us. To achieve this, goal I will entreat the Junior organizers to include in the program of activities skill training with the objective of empowering our Juniors to make them self-reliant as they work towards the attainment of their own potentials. It is my conviction that as we equip them with life-saving skills in their youth, their transfer to the adult Council and Courts would be made a lot easier due to their self-sufficiency. I will engage with the organizers to brainstorm and come out with the skills that would be beneficial to members of the Junior Order.

ONGOING PROJECT OF THE GRAND COURT

The completion of our meeting place must be at the heart of every sister as it would mark our collective achievement as Ladies of Marshall after 50 years of our formation.

Through the dynamism of my predecessors, we now have a fully fitted secretariat which is now operational. I commend my Immediate Past Grand Lady for the very effective manner she has fought to protect our property by the construction of the wall around the entire property. This has greatly secured the property from further encroachment. I will



also at this juncture acknowledge the generosity of all sisters who heeded her call and supported her to save our land from encroachment. I pray that the good lord continues to shower his blessings on all of you for your generosity.

I must say that all of us have also supported by contributing our widows mite in the payment of GHS 20.00 imposed on sisters to support the project. But my sisters, you would agree with me that the GHS20.00 we are now paying is woefully inadequate if we really want to see something concrete in our time. It is my belief that for an early completion of our project we will need a supporting fund to assist us achieve our desired goal. Towards the attainment of that goal, a fund to be known as **Supporting Pillars of the Grand Court** is hereby established. The objective of the fund is to invite benevolent Courts and all sisters who would be willing to part with some funds to be invested for a period to rally around and do it. The interest accruing from the fund would then be applied to support the early completion of our meeting hall.

As your Grand Lady, I am inviting willing sisters and Courts to be **Supporting Pillars** of our Grand Court project, by offering to pay a minimum amount of GHS1,000.00 to be invested for our project. Let us do this to glorify God in acknowledging the Almighty as the source of our abundance. This fund will be under the Chairmanship of

MRL Dame Sister Margaret Yirenyi with the other members being MRL Sister Cynthia Baffour, the Grand Advocate, RL sister Cynthia Lassey Ibrahim, RL Sister Irene Smith, RL Sister Sarah Aklibosu, Sister Joana Hassan, Sister Anna Benedicta Nettey, Sister Dr. Ivy Abu and Sister Magdalene Apenteng. MRL Sister Dame Theresa Pobee and MRL Sister Felicity Acquah shall be the advisors to this committee.

As a curtain raiser and my commitment to the growth and success of this fund, I am donating an amount of GHc5,000.00, as a startup seed money for the fund with a promise to add on as we go along.

The modalities and operation of the fund shall be made known at its official launch in February 2022, or anytime that the committee would deem it appropriate to launch it. I want to assure all contributors to this fund that your contributions would be duly acknowledged and appreciated by having your names engraved on a plaque to be mounted at the premises for posterity.

The invitation is to all sisters irrespective of where you are or may be, and I sincerely thank all who are willing to support me in this.

VISIBILITY FOR THE NOBLE ORDER

The Supreme/Grand IT and Communication Officers have worked tirelessly over the years to give visibility to the Noble Order. They have been able to do this through publications on the Knights



and Ladies of Marshall website, through live streaming of the Noble Orders key events on Facebook, the Bridge magazine the Catholic Standard, radio, and television as well as Online Papers. Through these the Noble Order's good works have been promoted both locally and globally such that the Knights and Ladies of Marshall have become a household name when it comes to support for the Church and its communities. Aside that, the Roman Catholic church has also received same endearment or even more. We say ayekoo to them. Well done!

However, there is more room for improvement in their collaborative efforts. Over the years the Website, Facebook and general communication have been managed by the Supreme IT and some selected Brother Regional IT officers only. The Grand Court would very much like to see some sisters also being given access to the Website and the Facebook account to support the work and to cater for the interest of the Grand Court. The two should be able to collaborate and work together to protect and guard the interest of the Noble Order as a whole. I intend to hold more discussions on this with the Supreme Knight for implementation to start soon.

I take this opportunity also to pay homage to my family, especially my husband, for always standing firmly by me to achieve this feat. To all of you as well as the many others that I have crossed path with on my way up, I thank you, and cherish you for your words of encouragement and friendship. In a very, very special way I want to appreciate the pioneers of our Noble Order who have toiled and offered exemplary leadership over the years to bring us this far and have continued to offer their rich experiences to our Noble Order. Currently we have the invaluable services of MRL Sis Dame Theresa Pobee, Most Respected Lady Margaret Gaisie-Essilifie, Most Respected Lady Agnes Gifty Amofa, Most Respected Lady Elizabeth Moses, Most Respected Lady Agnes Alberta Sekyi-Hughes, and most Respect Lady Mary Agagee to represent Togo/Benin. We shall continue to honor our pioneers.

Finally, my installation team, Sir Knights, Most Respected ladies, Respected Ladies, my sisters, in all



humility, I accept the honor done me as your 25th Grand Lady and pledge my unwavering commitment to serve you to the best of my ability.

Thank you, and may God continue to shower his infinite mercies and blessings on us.

Pères, Chevalier Suprême, Anciennes Grandes Dames, Messieurs Chevaliers, Dames Très Respectées, Adjoint Chevalier Suprême, Mesdames Respectées, mes chers officiers de notre Noble et honorable fraternité, bonsoir. C'est le jour que le seigneur a fait ; nous nous en réjouissons et en serons heureux. Avant de commencer mon discours, je voudrais solliciter votre indulgence pour observer une minute de silence en l'honneur de La Plus Respectée Sœur Victoria Yellu que nous avons douloureusement perdue au début de cette année et La Plus Respectée Sœur Frances Mensah Kane qui a également rejoint l'Ordre Noble ci-dessus. Heureusement pour moi, beaucoup d'entre eux seront là pendant très longtemps pour m'aider à tracer un avenir meilleur pour le Noble Ordre.

À toutes mes sœurs des tribunaux d'Accra et de Tema, je vous dédie cet honneur qui m'est fait et j'exprime également ma gratitude à tous mes frères, membres seniors et juniors de notre région, qui m'ont encouragé et offert au fil des ans des opportunités de servir à différents niveaux pour réaliser cet exploit. D'une manière très

particulière. Je tiens à remercier Sir Kt. Vétérinaire. Copain. Cdr. Dr Edmund S. K. Kwaw, le Directeur Suprême, Sir Kt. Copain. Samuel Barnes et MRL Sœur. Joana Barnes, Sir Kt. Copain. Eddie Prah, Sir Kt. Copain. Dr. Dr. Professeur George Wireko Brobbey et une foule d'autres personnes qui, pendant de nombreuses années, m'ont conseillé et encouragé au fur et à mesure que je les rencontrais.

À ce stade, permettez-moi de partager ma vision des Dames de Marshall alors que je prends le relais pour les deux prochaines années avec mon équipe d'officiers, en tant que votre Grande Dame. Mes sœurs, notre société, les Dames de Marshall ont célébré les 50 ans de son existence en 2019 qui a culminé en 2020, malgré le COVID-19. Cette année, le 25 Septembre 2021 exactement, la Grande Cour elle-même aura 50 ans depuis son inauguration en tant qu'autorité administrative de la société. Avec le

recul, nous pouvons dire avec fierté que nous avons accompli beaucoup de choses. D'un modeste début de neuf (9) Cours avec un effectif de 386 sœurs, nous sommes maintenant dans notre 157^{eme} Cour avec un effectif de plus de 4 000 sœurs réparties sur deux continents et huit pays et qui compte toujours. Des locaux loués où nous avons tenu nos réunions, beaucoup ont maintenant acquis leurs propres lieux de rencontre avec leurs homologues frères, et d'autres s'efforcent de le faire.

La Grande Cour n'est pas non plus en reste. Grâce à l'instrumentalisation et au travail acharné de mes prédécesseurs, nous pouvons maintenant nous vanter d'une propriété foncière abritant un secrétariat, avec une salle de réunion en construction, une auberge projetée dans un avenir pas si lointain, et une foule d'autres suggestions louables de sœurs à prendre en compte dans l'amélioration du projet. De plus, celles-ci ont été possibles grâce aux généreuses contributions et au soutien des sœurs des différentes cours, sans oublier le soutien actif de nos frères et du Conseil suprême.

À côté de nos réussites, chères sœurs, nous avons des défis qui nous posent de nombreuses menaces. Ce sont : Le manque d'unité parmi les sœurs, la délinquance parmi les membres, l'indiscipline et parfois l'apathie générale envers les programmes du Noble Ordre sont quelques exemples que je veux partager. Mes sœurs, nous n'avons pas réussi à relever ces défis et



avons donc refusé de permettre aux structures au sein de l'ordre noble de fonctionner. Nos échecs doivent être une grave préoccupation pour nous tous alors que nous avançons en tant que groupe sélectionné, appelé à servir Dieu et l'humanité. Nous ne devons pas faire honneur à ce que nous professons mais essayer de les intérioriser.

Pour moi, notre objectif devrait être de réfléchir profondément sur les cinquante années ou plus de notre existence en tant que groupe en termes des principes et des principes de l'Ordre Noble, et de traiter les tendances inacceptables parmi nous alors que nous progressons vers une vision plus positive et un avenir souhaitable.

Mes chères sœurs, pendant mon règne en tant que votre Grande Dame, je souhaiterai me concentrer sur deux domaines majeurs qui, je crois, peuvent aider à transformer notre société en une société que nous souhaiterions tous. Mon premier objectif sera de poursuivre un programme visant à améliorer la connaissance de nos sœurs dans les enseignements sociaux de l'Église. On dit que la connaissance est le pouvoir, et je suis fermement convaincu qu'à mesure que les sœurs connaîtront mieux les enseignements de l'Église et auront une meilleure compréhension et appréciation des rituels que nous accomplissons chaque fois que nous nous rencontrons, elles auront un impact positif sur les autres et aideront à éliminer les tendances négatives qui menacent de nous engloutir dans l'exercice de nos

fonctions. Pour ce faire, je ferais appel à notre directeur spirituel et à nos aumôniers suprêmes pour qu'ils proposent des programmes qui peuvent guider les aumôniers de nos tribunaux à mener des enseignements réguliers et des activités spirituelles pendant nos réunions de tribunal et tous les autres rassemblements spirituels.

Tout comme dans Lévitique 10 :11, le Seigneur Dieu a ordonné aux sacrificateurs : « ... d'enseigner au peuple d'Israël toutes les lois que Je vous ai données par l'intermédiaire de Moïse », nous aurons besoin de nos aumôniers pour nous enseigner les lois de l'église et du Noble Ordre pour que guidés, nous façonnions nos caractères pour qu'ils soient de bons et fidèles serviteurs de l'église et de l'humanité. Heureusement pour nous, le Conseil suprême a lancé la série de webinaires qui nous offre une autre occasion d'être éduqués dans les enseignements de l'Église. Je compte sur mes nobles dames régionales pour élaborer des programmes qui rendront les conférences du webinaire accessibles à toutes les sœurs.

Mon deuxième objectif serait d'inviter les sœurs à réfléchir profondément sur les préceptes et les principes de l'ordre noble tel qu'envisagé par les jeunes hommes galants de 13 et à considérer à quel point nous avons bien écouté les appels à l'unité, la charité, la fraternité et le service, dans les cinquante ans de notre existence en tant que Dames de Marshall. Mes sœurs, cette demande peut paraître répétitive puisque tous mes



prédécesseurs y ont insisté d'une manière ou d'une autre. Si j'insiste également là-dessus, c'est une indication qu'en tant que société, nous n'obtenons pas les résultats souhaités et nous devons donc constamment nous rappeler d'atteindre cet objectif.

Je crois qu'en adhérant strictement aux préceptes et aux principes de l'Ordre Noble, nous pouvons pleinement atteindre l'élévation spirituelle qui semble échapper à beaucoup d'entre nous et jeter nos Cours dans les dissensions, la discorde et l'indiscipline grossière. Mes chères sœurs, la vision peut sembler inaccessible à en juger par le niveau de désillusion de nos membres. En abordant ces situations, mon fervent espoir est que nous ferons tous un effort conscient pour travailler ensemble pour rendre cela possible afin qu'à la fin nous puissions faire de cette société la société préférée pour toute personne à rejoindre dans l'une de nos paroisses. Pour ma part, alors que j'assume la direction des Dames de Marshall et que je promets mon engagement envers ces idéaux, j'exigerais un engagement égal de toutes les sœurs et l'adhésion à ces idéaux et principes. C'est ma conviction que si nous respectons les règles et règlements édictés par mes prédécesseurs, nous pouvons continuellement profiter de l'unité, de la paix et de l'harmonie au sein de la société.

En tant que votre grande dame, j'assurerai le bien-être général de toutes les sœurs et je favoriserai

activement la sororité dont nous avons tant besoin alors que nous avançons en tant que société. Mes chères sœurs, cette vision de notre fraternité ne peut devenir possible que si nous nous y engageons toutes. Avant tout, il est impératif que nous laissions fonctionner toutes les structures qui ont été mises en place par nos dirigeants pour une administration harmonieuse au sein du Noble Ordre. Ce faisant, nous obtiendrions quelque chose de positif pour l'ordre en supprimant les images négatives qui ont été attribuées à notre Noble Ordre et en le rendant à nouveau attrayant pour les autres.

Ce sera ma prière constante que nous nous efforcions par nos conduites, que ce soit collectivement ou individuellement, d'agir en toutes circonstances d'une manière qui nous fera honneur, en disant ce que nous faisons et en faisant ce que nous disons. Nos performances doivent définir pour chaque action le résultat attendu, que ce soit en qualité, quantité, engagement et conformité attendue.

DELINQUANCE CROISSANTE CHEZ LES SŒURS:

Il devient de plus en plus clair que de nombreuses sœurs deviennent délinquantes à cause de leur incapacité à payer leurs cotisations ou à cause de commentaires ou d'attitudes parfois peu recommandables de certaines sœurs. En ce qui concerne le non-paiement des cotisations, je prierai la Cour d'examiner les cotisations imposées aux sœurs et



d'essayer de les atténuer. Sachant qu'une sœur doit s'acquitter de son obligation envers la Grande Cour, la Cour régionale et sa propre Cour, j'implore tous de prendre dûment en considération toutes ces obligations et de fixer des cotisations raisonnables qui pourraient facilement être gérées par autant de sœurs. Je crois que les tribunaux feraient mieux d'avoir de nombreuses sœurs qui paient leurs cotisations que d'avoir seulement quelques-unes qui peuvent se permettre de payer leurs cotisations, ce qui entraîne une longue liste de sœurs qui doivent des cotisations et ne peuvent pas assister aux réunions de la Cour par crainte d'être embarrassées.

Je voudrais aussi prier les sœurs généreusement dotées financièrement d'adopter en silence ou en silence celles qui ont moins de chance en les aidant s'acquitter de leurs obligations envers le tribunal. Souvenons-nous et gardons toujours à l'esprit qu'il y a des bénédictions fondamentales qui accompagnent toujours l'acte de donner plutôt que de recevoir. Sœurs, très souvent nous sommes incapables d'agir sur ces principes qui vont avec le concept de donner parce que nous manquons de foi. Si en effet nous sommes enfants de Dieu, nos actions doivent le représenter. Faisons confiance sincèrement à ce que la Sainte Bible nous dit et soyons heureux d'aider, croyant qu'en donnant aux autres, nous ouvrons également des canaux de bénédictions pour nous-mêmes.

Malgré cela, les sœurs devraient également faire bien de participer aux divers programmes financiers marshalliens qui ont été mis en place pour les soutenir dans leur futur bien-être. Les sœurs doivent noter qu'il s'agit de programmes qui leur ont ouvert de nouvelles opportunités d'améliorer leurs finances pour assurer leur propre bien-être et les programmes de charité de leurs tribunaux respectifs. Je m'attends à ce que mes nobles dames à tous les niveaux encouragent leurs sœurs à participer activement au Marshallan Security Trust (MST), au Marshallan Savings and Investment Fund (MASIF) et au Marshallan Medical Fund lorsqu'elles sont capables et fortes afin que leur avenir soit pris en charge.

C'est ma prière qu'au fur et à mesure que nous nous engageons pleinement dans ces projets, nous assisterons avec enthousiasme aux réunions et réduirons la vague actuelle de délinquance dans nos différents tribunaux.

INDISCIPLINE ENTRE SŒURS

Mes chères sœurs, notre société est un Ordre Noble. L'image que cela doit immédiatement évoquer dans nos esprits est celle d'un groupe de dames et de chevaliers disciplinés et soignés. Au début de mon discours, j'ai dit que l'indiscipline est un de nos défis qui devient de plus en plus préoccupant. C'est inacceptable. En tant que personnes préparées à occuper des postes de direction dans nos Églises, notre Société et nos formateurs pour notre jeunesse, de



tels actes d'indiscipline ne devraient pas être notre lot.

Par exemple, il est inacceptable que des sœurs se rassemblent sous les arbres pour converser ou flâner pendant la messe. Au lieu d'être des participants actifs à la célébration pour recevoir les bénédictions qui en découlent, l'impression que nous laissons est que nous ne valorisons pas la messe, ni les grâces qui en découlent. Certains de nos prêtres se sont souvent plaints de nous être assis et d'attendre que les bus partent pendant la messe et auraient souhaité que nous les rejoignons au lieu d'attendre un bus en retard. Apprécions les choses que nous avons. La messe est la quintessence de la mission de salut de l'église, que nous devons toujours vénérer.

J'implore tous les tribunaux d'éviter de tels comportements qui ont un impact négatif sur notre Ordre noble. Mes sœurs, nous avons besoin de la protection de la messe et nous devons saisir toutes les occasions qui se présentent pour y participer.

Notre mode de s'habiller est un autre point aigre, ce qui a amené la Grande Cour à envoyer de nombreux extraits à ce sujet pour avertir les sœurs, mais celles-ci sont toujours désobéies. Nous devons également nous efforcer de corriger nos habitudes de consommation et d'alimentation en public.

L'engagement de relations malsaines et amoureuses avec nos frères en dépit de notre code d'éthique et de la constitution doit également être une grave préoccupation pour nous tous car ils

jettent le discrédit sur notre image. Si nous devons être la société préférée dans nos paroisses pour assurer la croissance de nos membres, ce sont les domaines qui nécessitent notre attention sérieuse.

Pour enrayer ces excès, j'appliquerai strictement les règles et règlements établis pour corriger ces tendances indésirables, pour assurer la bonne administration et la santé dans l'ordre noble. En cela, je compte sur mes Nobles Dames régionales pour faire respecter les lois et prendre des mesures disciplinaires contre les sœurs qui bafouent délibérément les règles relatives à l'habillement et au comportement général dans les réunions et les lieux publics.

Cependant, dans l'exercice de leurs mandats, elles doivent noter qu'elles doivent faire preuve de retenue pour corriger les sœurs qui se trompent. Il doit y avoir un respect mutuel pour toutes les sœurs, quelle que soit leur position dans la vie. Nous devons apprendre et tirer des leçons de notre Seigneur Jésus-Christ et de l'humilité de Marie, notre Mère, Médiatrice et Patronne. Aussi riche que fût notre seigneur, il s'est fait pauvre à cause de nous pour nous enrichir. En tant que dirigeants, nous ne devrions pas dominer nos sœurs et traiter de manière excessive celles qui sont laissées de côté. Parfois, un mot doux ou une incitation retournait la sœur errante. Corrigeons-nous les uns les autres avec amour pour atteindre la discipline à laquelle nous aspirons. Dans le même ordre d'idées, les sœurs cadettes doivent



apprendre à obéir aux règles de l'ordre et à respecter l'autorité.

ORGANISATION DE L'ORDRE DES JEUNES.

Mes chères sœurs, ma vision pour l'ordre junior est de voir des chevaliers et des dames juniors motivés préparés et équipés pour occuper des postes de direction après nous. Pour atteindre cet objectif, je prierai les organisateurs juniors d'inclure dans le programme d'activités une formation professionnelle dans le but de donner à nos juniors les moyens de les rendre autonomes alors qu'ils travaillent à la réalisation de leur propre potentiel. J'ai la conviction qu'au fur et à mesure que nous les doterons de compétences vitales dans leur jeunesse, leur transfert au conseil et aux tribunaux pour adultes serait beaucoup plus facile en raison de leur autonomie. Je m'engagerai avec les organisateurs pour réfléchir et proposer les compétences qui seraient bénéfiques aux membres de l'ordre junior.

PROJET EN COURS DE LA GRANDE COUR.

L'achèvement de notre lieu de rencontre doit être au cœur de chaque sœur car il marquerait notre accomplissement collectif en tant que Dames de Marshall après 50 ans de notre formation.

Grâce au dynamisme de mes prédécesseurs, nous disposons d'un secrétariat parfaitement équipé dans lequel nous pourrions

désormais nous déplacer et occuper à tout moment. Je félicite mon Immédiate Past Grande Dame pour la manière très efficace avec laquelle elle s'est battue pour protéger notre propriété par la construction du mur autour de l'ensemble de la propriété. Cela a considérablement sécurisé la propriété contre d'autres empiètements. Je saluerai également à ce stade la générosité de toutes les sœurs qui ont répondu à l'appel de notre Immédiate Past Grande Dame de la soutenir pour sauver notre terre d'un empiètement grave. Je prie pour que le bon Dieu continue de vous bénir tous pour votre générosité.

Je dois dire que nous avons tous également soutenu en contribuant notre acarien de veuve en payant les 20,00 GHc imposés aux sœurs pour soutenir le projet. Mais mes sœurs, vous conviendrez avec moi que le GHc20 que nous payons actuellement est terriblement insuffisant si nous voulons vraiment voir quelque chose de concret à notre époque. Je suis convaincu que pour un achèvement rapide de notre projet, nous aurons besoin d'un fonds de soutien pour nous aider à atteindre notre objectif souhaité. En vue d'atteindre cet objectif, un fonds appelé « piliers de soutien de la Grande Cour » est créé par la présente. L'objectif du fonds est d'inviter des Cours et sœurs bienveillantes qui seraient prêtes à se séparer de certains fonds à investir pour une période de se rallier et de le faire. Ce fonds sera sous la présidence de MRL Dame Sister Margaret Yirenkyi avec les autres membres étant MRL Sister Cynthia Baffour, la grande avocate, RL Sister Cynthia Lassey Ibrahim, RL Sister Irene Smith, RL Sister Sarah Aklibosu, Sister Joana Hassan, Sister Anna Benedicta Nettey, Sister Dr Ivy Abu et sœur Magdalene Apenteng. MRL Sœur Dame Theresa Pobee et MRL Sœur Felicity Acquah seront les conseillères de ce comité.

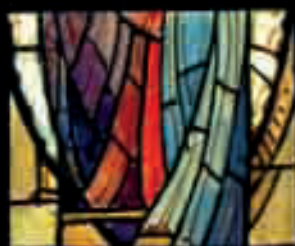
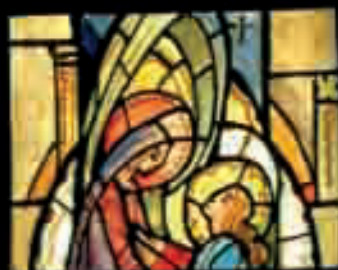
