He was born on 18th of December 1829. His father was a Presbyterian Minister and his mother Mary Richmond was a housewife.

EDUCATION

At age 16, he lost his right arm as a result of an accident gunshot. Not disturbed by this

occurrence, he still continued his education at Oxford University and graduated at age 18 in 1847. He went to read law and was called to the bar at Middle Temple in 1868 (Lincoln's Inn)

APPOINTMENT

In the year 1852, he was appointed as

an Anglican Minister Curate t Tryssull. In 1859, he left for St. Bartholomew (London) where he continued his Curacy.

CONVERSION

Lesson

& Motivation

for us as

Marshallans:

"Disability is not inability."

On the 21st November 1857, he converted to a layman in the Catholic Church by Rev. Fr. Robert Aston Cotton, later Bishop Cotton.

He continued work as Chief Magistrate and Judicial Assessor appointed as Chief Justice for British West Africa (Ghana and Nigeria).

> In 1887, he was offered justice of Nigeria which he declined due to ill health but helped to establish the Judicial System in Nigeria.


MISSIONARY ZEAL

He worked hard for the re-establishment of the of the Catholic Church in G h a n a a n d w a s instrumental in Rev. Frs. Auguste Moreau and Eugene Murat's (SMA) coming to the Gold Coast

on the 18th of May, 1880. On the 29th June, 1882 he was Knighted, KCMG by the Queen Victoria of Great Britain. He was made the Knight Commander of the Order of St. Gregory (KCSG) by Pope Leo XIII in Rome on the 20th January, 1889.


DEATH



LEADERSHIP VISION

Kindly permit me to share my vision as the 26th Grand Lady for the Ladies of Marshall for the next two years with my team of Officers.

1. Deepen Spirituality

My dear Sisters and Brothers, I believe we joined this society, first and foremost, to help us deepen our understanding of the problems of human destiny and other related problems; problems that are relevant today and throughout all ages. How do we experience them? How do we manage to accept them with courage and peace of mind? What do we know with certainty and what do we no longer question, what do we consider indisputable and unchangeable? We need to talk about the drama of our true selves and not about the artificial roles that may be imposed on us by circumstances. We need to talk about our disappointments and our hopes; about our religious faith, our trust in God and our prayer life.

Dear Sisters and Brothers, the purpose for which groups like ours get together ought to be more spiritual than social. There is a general agreement that the reason groups such as ours exist is because belonging to a larger congregation does not always provide Catholics with the opportunities to interact effectively and beneficially. More commonly, Societies in the Church are regarded as a way of organizing our parish congregations to promote their relevance and effectiveness.

Groups and Societies in the Church have an inward, upward and outward focus. Inwardly, they nurture members and bond them to each other through spiritual growth including developing Godly interactions and skills in serving others in Christ. Upwardly, they nurture members and bond them to God through Christ. Every Christian needs to grow in intimacy with God. Outwardly, there is the need to reach out to the immediate neighborhood as genuine witnesses to Christ's saving power.

Sisters and Brothers, I would like to reiterate the fact that our Order is rooted in spirituality and that needs to be deepened. Despite the existing spiritual activities and periods in place, it is important to deepen them and take advantage of other opportunities that present themselves; or fashion out new/additional ones to help instill the God-fearing and enabling environment in the conduct of all our affairs, so that the social impacts do not dominate what the noble order should be known for. To achieve these goals, in my tenure of office, I plan to deepen the spiritual formation of members and let gospel values inspire whatever we do. Among other things I hope to focus on, but not limited to the following;

- Using bible study outlines specially prepared by our Supreme Chaplains. for our purpose.
- Discuss and analyze the gospel/reading for the week, asking questions to clarify its meaning and apply it to our lives.
- Explaining the spiritual significance of our various rituals.
- Introducing spiritual reflections during court meetings by readers and lecturers.

I believe that these activities will enhance our house fellowship and are necessary to nurture and monitor our spiritual growth, physical wellbeing and Godly interactions of our members.

2. Unity of Purpose and Making Established Structures Work.

The goal of structures in every community or establishment is to initiate and foster unity. Unity is defined as the condition in which something forms an organic whole. Although different elements are involved, the whole is characterized by agreement and internal coherence. This definition applies on all fours to the unity I envision for our Noble Order to the extent that we share a common foundation of faith and practice. In the New Testament there is an unlimited universal dimension to the unity of believers. This unity knows no geographic or cultural bounds. It is based on Jesus whose death and resurrection opened the way to new alliances for all people.

As regards the foregoing, structures are put in place to guide and direct the unity of purpose of every believing community in the Church. Hence in my administration, laid down structures will continue to work. While welcoming wise counsel, as much as possible, external influences or interferences will be discouraged and minimized as these impede and hamper court administration.

I am all for more vibrant and efficient structures at all levels. It is my expectation that the following efficient and transparent management systems designed to hold the society together will be given prominence.

- Application of modern technology
- Enforcement of adherence to laid down rules
- Leadership formation at all levels
- Learning lessons from our past performance and using best practice to guide decision making so that the society will be responsive to changing trends.

3. Enhance charity within and among Sisters

In the Old Testament, God told the children of Israel to be generous (Deuteronomy 24:17-22). In the New Testament, there are many examples of generosity and solidarity among local Churches (2 Corinthians 8:2). St. James in his letter recognizes that while faith alone is enough for salvation, action must flow from our faith. As he says; "show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by what I do" (James 2:18). He argues that it is totally inadequate to simply say, "Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well..." to a brother or sister who has nothing (James 2:16). We must clothe and feed them if we are to demonstrate the authenticity of our faith in Christ.

Sisters, we will do well particularly by supporting our distressed Sisters financially, to assuage the suffering of those in genuine need. Sometimes uncontrollable situations make some Sisters dormant or delinquent. We should be able to identify the challenges of Sisters on a case by case basis and support those who will need a little push to engage in some productive or income generating ventures to sustain them. The existence of Marshallan Relief and Development Services (MAREDES) is for external charity but it is important to address needs of Sisters who are in dire straits. By doing this, we will be helping to bring down the rate of delinquency among Sisters. At the end of my tenure it is my hope that delinquency would have been reduced by 70 percent up from the current level of 60 percent. While I encourage you to continue contributing towards external charity, I want to plead with Sisters that in spite of the hard times, we should sacrifice a little to increase our internal charity works. The old saying that *"charity begins at home"* should motivate us to help our own.

4. Pay Attention to the Youth.

It is an established fact that the young are the future of any institution. It is therefore important that we pay more attention to the junior courts and councils. We need to make a more deliberate and sustained effort to involve and give them roles to play. By this we will enhance their sense of belonging and boost their confidence over time.

In furtherance of this noble objective, I exhort their organizers to intensify their efforts on the following;

- Endeavour to support through Courts and Councils, qualified but needy Sisters and Brothers in the Junior Courts and Councils to transition into the adult courts and councils. Since membership of our order is purely voluntary, we should also identify uninterested over aged Junior Sisters and Brothers and counsel them to join the Adult Courts and Councils.
- Make Court and Council meetings more engaging and participatory to ensure that the younger Junior Sisters and Brothers do not feel excluded. I therefore support the processes already set in motion to review the Ritual Books to make them more fit for purpose by giving prominence to Catholic social teachings and good character formation.
- Take advantage of the positives of ICT to initiate appropriate projects and engage the young where they can exhibit their talents and knowledge. This will make them feel recognized and appreciated and also make them see themselves as being useful to the Order.

5. Grand Court Secretariat Project

This project should be dear to the hearts of all Sisters because of the immense benefits that will accrue from it when it is complete and operational. My focus therefore will be to continue with the construction of the Secretariat building from where my predecessors have diligently gotten to. I will strive depending on the availability of funds, to bring the project to an appreciable level so that upon completion it will be convenient and comfortable for our meetings and other events. Together let us all help to make this desire of ours work to the glory of God. I exhort Sisters to contribute their "widow's mite". No contribution is too small. Above all, remember that God loves a cheerful giver and will surely reward each giver a hundred fold.

Now let us turn our attention to and remember those who are no longer with us. I would humbly request that we observe a minute silence in honor of MRL, Sister Victoria Yellu my sister and mentor who we lost 3years ago, and Sir Knight Bro Ernest Amoako Arhin, who we lost in March this year, and all other MRLS, who have been called to glory. I humbly ask the supreme chaplain to say a prayer for the peaceful repose of their souls.

CONCLUSION

VISION DU LEADERSHIP

Veuillez me permettre de partager avec vous ma Vision en tant que la 26e Grande Dame des Dames de Marshall pour les deux prochaines années.

1. Approfondir la spiritualité

Mes chères sœurs et frères, je crois que nous avons rejoint cette société avant tout, pour nous aider à approfondir notre compréhension des problèmes du destin humain et d'autres problèmes relatifs; des problèmes pertinents aujourd'hui à tout âge. Comment nous les expérimentons? Comment pouvons-nous les accepter avec courage et tranquillité d'esprit? Que savons-nous avec certitude et que nous ne remettons plus en question, que considérons-nous incontestables et immuables? Nous devons parler du drame de notre vrai moi et non des rôles artificiels qui peuvent nous être imposés par les circonstances. Nous devons parler de nos déceptions et de nos espoirs; sur notre foi religieuse, notre confiance en Dieu et notre vie de prière.

Mes chers Sœurs et Frères, le but pour lequel des groupes comme le nôtre se rassemblent devrait être plus spirituel que social. Il y a un accord général sur le fait que la raison pour laquelle des groupes comme le nôtre existent est que l'appartenance à une plus grande congrégation ne fournit pas toujours aux catholiques la possibilité d'interagir de manière efficace et bénéfique. Plus communément, les Sociétés dans l'Église sont considérées comme un moyen d'organiser nos congrégations paroissiales pour promouvoir leur pertinence et leur efficacité.

Les groupes et les sociétés dans l'Église ont une orientation vers l'intérieur, vers le haut et vers l'extérieur. Intérieurement, ils nourrissent les membres et les lient les uns aux autres par la croissance spirituelle, y compris le développement d'interactions divines et de compétences pour servir les autres en Christ. Vers le haut, ils nourrissent les membres et les lient à Dieu par le Christ. Chaque chrétien a besoin de grandir dans l'intimité avec Dieu. Extérieurement, il est nécessaire de tendre la main au voisinage immédiat en tant que véritables témoins de la puissance salvatrice du Christ.

Mes chers Frères et Sœurs, je voudrais réitérer le fait que notre Ordre est enraciné dans la spiritualité et qu'il faut l'approfondir. Malgré les activités spirituelles existantes et les périodes en place, il est important de les approfondir et de profiter des autres opportunités qui se présentent ; ou en créer de nouveaux/supplémentaires pour aider à instiller l'environnement craignant Dieu et propice dans la conduite de toutes nos affaires, afin que les impacts sociaux ne dominent pas ce pour quoi l'ordre noble devrait être connu. Pour atteindre ces objectifs, au cours de mon mandat, je prévois d'approfondir la formation spirituelle des membres et de laisser les valeurs de l'Évangile inspirer tout ce que nous faisons. Parmi tant de choses que j'espère me concentrer sur les éléments suivants, mais sans s'y limiter:

- utilisation des plans d'étude biblique spécialement préparés par nos Chapelains Suprêmes sur notre but.
- Discutez et analysez l'évangile/la lecture de la semaine, en posant des questions pour clarifier sa signification et l'appliquer à nos vies.
- Expliquer la signification spirituelle de nos différents rituels.
- Introduire des réflexions spirituelles lors des réunions de la cour par les lecteurs et les conférenciers.

Je crois que ces activités amélioreront notre communion fraternelle et sont nécessaires pour nourrir et surveiller notre développement spirituel, notre bien-être physique et les interactions divines de nos membres.

2. Objectif d'unité et le fonctionnement des structures établies.

Le but des structures dans chaque communauté ou établissement est d'initier et de favoriser l'unité. L'unité est définie comme la condition dans laquelle quelque chose forme un tout organique. Bien que différents éléments soient impliqués, l'ensemble est caractérisé par l'accord et la cohérence interne. Cette définition

s'applique à tout aspect et à la vision que j'envisage pour notre Noble Ordre dans la mesure où nous partageons un fondement commun de foi et de pratique. Dans le Nouveau Testament, il y a une dimension universelle illimitée à l'unité des

croyants. Cette unité ne connaît aucune frontière géographique ou culturelle. Elle est basée sur

Nous devons les vêtir et les nourrir si nous voulons démontrer l'authenticité de notre foi en Christ.

Mes chères Sœurs, nous devons particulièrement tout faire en soutenant financièrement nos Sœurs en détresse, pour apaiser la souffrance de ceux qui en ont vraiment besoin. Des situations parfois incontrôlables rendent certaines Sœurs endormies ou délinguantes. Nous devrions être en mesure d'identifier les défis des Sœurs cas par cas et de soutenir celles qui auront besoin d'un petit coup de pouce pour s'engager dans des entreprises productives ou génératrices de revenus pour les soutenir. L'existence des Services de Soulagements et Développement Marshall (Marshallan Relief and Development Services-MAREDES) est destinée à la charité externe, mais il est important de répondre aux besoins des Sœurs qui sont dans une situation désespérée. Ce faisant, nous contribuerons à faire baisser le taux de délinquance des Sœurs. À la fin de mon mandat, j'espère que la délinquance sera réduite à 70 % par rapport au niveau actuel de 60 %. Alors, je vous encourage à continuer à contribuer à la charité externe, je veux supplier aux Sœurs malgré les difficultés, de sacrifier un peu pour augmenter nos activités de charités internes. Le vieil adage dit que " la charité bien ordonnée commence par soi " devrait être une source de motivation pour nous d'aider les nôtres.

4. Écoutez aux jeunes.

Les jeunes sont l'avenir de toute institution. Il est donc important que nous accordions plus d'attention à la cour et aux conseils des jeunes. Nous devons faire un effort plus délibéré et durable pour les impliquer et leur donner un rôle à jouer. Nous renforcerons ainsi leur sentiment d'appartenance et leur confiance au fil du temps. Dans la réalisation de cet objectif noble, j'exhorte leurs organisateurs à intensifier leurs efforts sur les points suivants :

 S'efforcer d'aider, par le biais de la cour et des conseils, les Sœurs et les Frères qualifiés mais nécessiteux de la cour et conseiller les juvéniles à faire la transition

- vers la cour et les conseils des adultes. Étant donné que l'adhésion à notre ordre est purement volontaire, nous devrions également identifier les grand-e-s et petit-e-s Sœurs et Frères désintéressés et leur conseiller de rejoindre la Fraternité et des conseils des adultes.
- Rendre les réunions et conseil de la Cour plus engageantes et participatives pour s'assurer que les plus jeunes Sœurs et Frères ne se sentent pas exclus. Je soutiens donc les processus déjà mis en place pour réviser les livres Rituels afin de les rendre plus adaptés à leur objectif en mettant en évidence les enseignements sociaux catholiques et la bonne formation du caractère.
- Profiter des avantages de la formation informatique pour initier des projets appropriés et engager les jeunes là où ils peuvent exposer leurs talents et leurs connaissances. Cela les fera se sentir reconnus et appréciés et les fera également se sentir utiles à l'Ordre.
